

## Tour the International Perfumery Museum (MIP) gardens (Mouans-Sartoux)

The farmers of Grasse began to grow the region’s perfume plants in the early 17th century. Planted as crops throughout the Grasse countryside were tuberose, jasmine, orange trees, Centifolia rose, violet, mimosa, daffodil, lavender... In short, Grasse became “an enormous flower field”!

The MIP Gardens are both part of the mission of the International Perfumery Museum, the world’s only public museum dedicated to perfumery, and a project to encourage discovery of the perfume flowers and plants of the Pays de Grasse (Grasse region), enlightening the public on this natural and agricultural heritage and uniting a variety of actors in agriculture, tourism, and the local economy.



## Guided tour of the Domaine St Jacques du Couloubrier (Grasse)

A remarkable garden created by Russell Page in 1950. Long abandoned, it found new life in 2005 under the care of new owners committed to a faithful restitution. The garden constantly evolves upon this newly restored foundation through the diligence of the current head gardener, with new creations and never-ending botanic enrichment.

Perfume plants are thus amply present: Centifolia rose, Grasse jasmine, verbena, lemongrass, tuberose, and more. There are also citrus fruit trees: kaffir lime, citron, and bitter orange, along with other unique plants to discover in this 250-tree olive grove spanning eight hectares, from varieties of wisteria, bulbs flowers, and many other species.



## Tour of Espace Terroirs (Grasse)

Nicolas and Barbara de Choudens are your warm and friendly hosts happy to guide you in sampling the genuine products and traditional savoir-faire Provence and the region’s backcountry.

Enjoy free tastings of a variety of olive oils and an aperitif made with white wine and floral syrup. Roam the charming shop, with its ochre-colored walls topped with solid oak roof beams: there are some twenty different Provencal honeys, aperitifs, and liqueurs, AOC wines, traditional candies, jams, nougats, and more, all from a hundred Provence producers.

A floral gift will be yours when you come to visit.
