Sightseeing suggestions in the heart of the Medieval City

The Provencal Art & History Museum

Located in Grasse's most elegant residence, the former mansion of the Marquise de Clapiers-Cabris, Mirabeau's sister, the Museum recreates scenes of everyday life, with furniture, paintings, accessories, showing the true Provencal lifestyle.

The collections include exquisite and rare items such as pottery, ceramics, furniture and decorative objets d'art.

The Villa-Musée Fragonard

The famous eighteenth-century painter Jean-Honoré Fragonard was born in Grasse. He presented the Comtesse du Barry, mistress of King Louis XV, four paintings depicting the stages of the conquest of love, and magnificent replicas of these works adorn the Villa salons.

In this elegant 18th-century country manor, visitors can also wander the gardens planted with palm trees and a number of exquisite plant species and admire an amazing trompe l'oeil attributed to Alexandre Fragonard, son and wunderkind Jean-Honoré Fragonard, who executed the work in the stairwell at the age of 13.

Explore the city by sightseeing train.

Grasse's little sightseeing train will take you through the streets and alleys of the historic heart of Grasse.



As you stroll the shady streets, take a moment to cross the threshold of some of Grasse's enchanting shops selling local specialty foods: fougassettes (a traditional slightly-sweet bread flavored with orange blossom essence) and other treats at La Maison Venturini, Daskalidès chocolates, wines, liqueurs and flower products at the Le Vin en Toute Simplicité wine shop, or local products at the Marthe Dumontel market...
